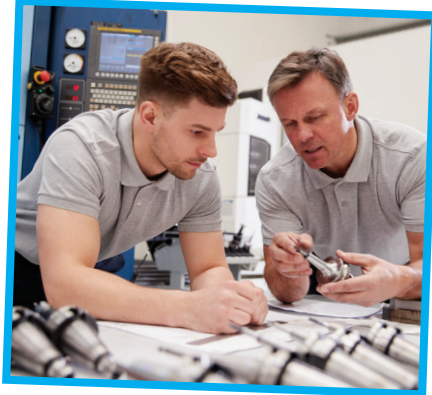


National Government clout delivering local benefits

38,950 APPRENTICES IN SEFTON SINCE 2010

20,520 in the Bootle Constituency, 9,290 in the Sefton Central Constituency and 9,140 in the Southport Constituency.

This is part of 5.7 million apprenticeships across the country.



EXTRA £3.1M TO SUPPORT BUS SERVICES IN MERSEYSIDE

Sefton, along with the wider Merseyside area, received an extra £3.1 million to support local bus services, as part of £80m being invested nationally by the Government in 2024.

The money means people across the Merseytravel area have benefitted from a total of £18.5m from the



Conservative Government to support bus services since 2022, over and above what Council Taxpayers contribute to Merseytravel.

SEFTON BOROUGH RECEIVES OVER £2.3M FROM THE GOVERNMENT'S YOUTH INVESTMENT FUND

£2.27 MILLION BOOST FOR SPORTS CLUBS AND FACILITIES ON MERSEYSIDE

Sports clubs and facilities across Merseyside are to receive a boost worth £2.27 million.

The latest allocation from the Multi-Sport Grassroots Facilities Programme will see more high quality facilities being made available for people to play football, rugby and other grassroots sports.

Nationally, £29 million is being invested in new pitches, changing rooms, goalposts and floodlights during 2024/25.
